JASON WEBER

Jason Weber has worked in law enforcement since 1990. He has been with the Fox Crossing Police Department since 1992 and is currently assigned to the investigations division as the department's Community Liaison Officer and Media Spokesperson. Jason also serves as the vice president for the Wisconsin Crime Prevention Practitioners Association.



Jason was instrumental in developing Fox Crossing's Chronic Nuisance Ordinance and Abatement Program. This program has proved to be a success and was recognized as a finalist for the 2008 Sir Robert Peel award by the Wisconsin Association of Community Oriented Police. Jason also spearheaded a coalition that developed the nationally recognized program *Good Drugs Gone Bad* that targets prescription drug abuse and that program was awarded the 2015 Community Policing Project of the Year by the WI Association of Community Oriented Police.

Jason was awarded the 2010 Law Enforcement Partner of the Year from the WI Prevention Network on Substance Abuse, the 2010 Crime Prevention Practitioner of the Year from the WI Crime Prevention Practitioners Association, the 2011 Historian of the Year by the Outagamie County Historical Society and the 2014 Fox Valley Technical College's Outstanding Alumni Award.

Jason teaches a variety of policing topics for the National Criminal Justice Training Center and is an instructor for the WI Safe and Healthy Schools on drug abuse prevention and active shooter response. Jason is also a published author; having written books on the history of the Town of Menasha and the Village of Kimberly and two books on Active Threat Mitigation.

AARON ZEMLOCK

Aaron Zemlock has worked in law enforcement for the past 20+ years. In that time he has worked in many different positions within the police department. Aaron worked primarily night shift patrol for the first 2 years and then moved into Maplewood Middle School as a police liaison officer for about 10 years. Aaron then returned to patrol and in January 2010 and started the role as the Community Liaison Officer and Public Information Officer.
